

COUNCIL MEETING
October 27, 2014

Council met this PM with the following members present: Taylor, Blaising Mahek, Herold and Buckner.

Mayor Sharrock presided over the meeting, which was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance and a prayer by Mayor Sharrock.

Motion by Blaising, second by Mahek to approve minutes from October 13, 2014 Five (5) yeas. Motion by Mahek, second by Herold to approve minutes from October 20, 2014. Five (yeas).

Motion by Buckner, second Herold to approve Agenda for October 27 2014. Five (5) yeas.

Dave Crokier, 352 Clink Blvd. – Mr. Cookie addressed Mayor Sharrock about some issues that he had with his position, integrity, and credibility as Mayor. Mayor Sharrock responded to his comments. Councilman Taylor and Herald also commented.

Joyce Moore, 523 S Seltzer Street – Mrs. Moore complained about property on Arnold Street that was recently purchased at an auction, which is either zoned light industrial or commercial and stated that there is someone living on the property. Mrs. Moore also stated some shady activity going on, she found a syringe on her property. Mr. Milliron stated that it was zoned light industrial. Chief Weisman stated department had an open burn call and Chief Butler was only aware of couple calls.

Dave Duncan, 308 W Bucyrus St. – Mr. Duncan questions police conduct in issuing speeding tickets. Mr. Duncan feels “certain” citizens receive a special pass when it comes to traffic tickets, some families not held to the same level. Mr. Duncan ask Chief Butler if it is true. Chief Butler states that a citation was destroyed only because the officer was unsure if the violation occurred. Chief Butler also reinforced to Mr. Duncan that there is no order in place about certain families receiving a pass on citations.

Marc Milliron, Village Administrator – Mr. Millrion commented on the following: 1) Res. 14-11 – OPWC for 2015 paving project. Mr. Millrion stated that the village did not receive any monies again from the county to assist in funding. 2) Res. 14-12 is a joint effort in preserve the water tables. 3) Ord. 3098 – rezoning to light industrial – third reading. 4) Ord. 3100 – Rules of Council changing language to act as a body and not as an individual. 5) Ord. 3101 – changing liability carriers from ACC Midland Insurance to Rinehart, Walters and Danner which would be in an increase of \$6200.00. 6) Cedar Mill update – stating that completed waterline loop was completed with a slight increase in residential pressure, and with no change in static pressure. 7) The price of salt has increase from \$50/ton to \$135/ton for 2014/2015. Mr. Millrion also stated that the state will maintain SR 61 and SR 181 this year.

Gloria McDonald, Fiscal Officer – Mrs. McDonald stated that they would be meeting with health insurance providers next week.

Mike Weisman, Fire Chief – Chief Weisman stated that the department has receivable covers available.

Dave Sharrock, Mayor – Mayor Sharrock commented on the following: 1) received a letter from Randy Hister complementing the Village on a great Harvest Festival. 2) Thanked citizens, businesses, Red Cross, and Lions Club who took part in our annual Trick or Treat. 3) Congratulated Bob Kurtzman and his staff at FX-Lab, which was ranked 3rd in Ohio by Reader's Pick. 4) The 4th Annual Community Care Walk will be held in New Washington on November 1st, starting at 9:00 a.m. 5) reminded everyone to vote on November 4th.

Resolution 14-11 – A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE VILLAGE ADMINISTRATOR TO PREPARE AND SUBMIT AN APPLICATION TO PARTICIPATE IN THE OHIO PUBLIC WORKS COMMISSION STATE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT ISSUE 1, ROUND 29, AND/OR LOCAL TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM AND TO EXECUTE CONTRACTS AS REQUIRED, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY. First reading held. Motion by Herold, second by Buckner for suspension of the rules for the second and third readings. Roll Call – Taylor, Blaising, Mahek, Herold, and Buckner. Five (5) yeas. Motion by Buckner, second by Blaising for adoption. Roll Call – Taylor, Blaising, Mahek, Herold and Buckner. Five (5) yeas. Resolution NO. 14-11 adopted.

Resolution 14-12 – A RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF A MORATORIUM CONDUCTING DEEP INJECTION WASTE WELLS IN THE COUNTY OF CRAWFORD, OHIO PENDING THE ISSUANCE OF A REPORT BY THE FEDERAL ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY. First reading held. Motion by Blaising, second by Herold for suspension of the rules for the second and third readings. Roll Call – Taylor, Blaising, Mahek, Herold, and Buckner. Five (5) yeas. Motion by Mahek, second by Herold for adoption. Roll Call – Blaising, Mahek, Herold, Buckner, and Taylor. Five (5) yeas. Resolution NO. 14-12 adopted.

Ordinance No. 3098 – AN ORDINANCE TO REZONE VILLAGE INLOT NUMBERS 1139 THRU 1146, AND A PORTION OF OUTLOTS 196 AND 197 FROM RESIDENTIAL R-1 TO LIGHT INDUSTRIAL M-1. Third reading. Motion by Herold, second by Buckner for adoption. Roll Call – Mahek, Herold, Buckner, Taylor and Blaising. Five (5) yeas. Ordinance No. 3098 adopted.

Ordinance No. 3100 – AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND RULE 8 OF ORDINANCE 2991, RULES OF COUNCIL BY THE ADDITION OF RULE 8 B. LEGISLATIVE POWER CONFIRMING COUNCIL ACTS AS LEGISLATIVE BODY AND NOT BY ITS SEPARATE MEMBERS AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY. First reading held. Motion by Blaising, second by Herold to TABLE Ordinance No. 3100. Five (5) yeas.

Ordinance No. 3101 – AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE VILLAGE OF CRESTLINE TO CONTRACT WITH RINEHART-WALTERS-DANNER INSURANCE AGENCY IN ORDER TO PROVIDE THE VILLAGE WITH CASUALTY, PROPERTY AND LIABILITY INSURANCE AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY. First reading held. Motion by Blaising, second by Buckner for suspension of the rules for the second and third readings. Roll call – Taylor, Blaising, Mahek, Herold and Buckner. Five (5) yeas. Motion by Blaising, second by Mahek for adoption. Roll Call – Herold, Buckner, Taylor, Blaising and Mahek. Five (5) yeas.

Unfinished Business – Mr. Herald stated that the Community Development donated \$50.00 to the Police and Fire Departments for their help on Shred It Day.

New Business- Councilman Blaising nominated Eugene Toy to fill the vacant council seat with a second by Councilman Herold. Roll Call – Taylor (yea), Blaising (yea), Mahek (nay), Herold (yea) and Buckner (nay). Mayor Sharrock proceeded to swear in Eugene Toy as the new councilman for the Village of Crestline.
